Statement of Principle

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment
- ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare
- increasing education in training and horsemanship practices
- requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions
- reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

The Lower Island Equestrian Club April 18th, July 11th and September 20th competitions are Sanctioned Bronze Class competition members of Equine Canada, 2685 Queensview Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2B 8K2 and are governed by the rules of EC.

Tests Offered: Test of Choice DC Walk/Trot Test 2 through Fourth Level; FEI Test of Choice. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

- Each horse/rider combination may enter up to three tests space providing. Please list tests in order of preference and send the Entry Fee for the third test on a separate cheque.
- Hors Concours tests are permitted. Late entries are permitted providing space is available. There will be an extra charge of \$10 for late entries.
- Proof of an EC Bronze License must be submitted with Entry Form and appropriate fees. If this is the first show you have ridden with LIEC in 2008, please submit proof of current HCBC membership as well.
- Braiding is expected. Please go to www.equinecanada.ca for current rules and dressage tests.
- Dress Code as per EC (Dressage) Rules Article E 4.1.4 (dark colored jacket; ASTM/SEI or BSI approved headgear; white or light colored breeches; tie, hunting stock or choker; gloves; black or brown boots (plain, laced or with zippers); black or brown half chaps or half boots zipped over short boots may be worn; spurs are optional.
- Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times when mounted.
- Boots and bandages are permitted (Article 4.9).
- Rosettes to 6th place; placing based on percentage will be awarded in classes with 1 entry; High Percent of Show rosettes will be awarded in each division.
- Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds may be selected for equine medication control testing.
- The Entry Form must be signed by the Person Responsible who must be an EC Sport License holder. In the case of junior entries, parents or guardians are entitled to sign their child's entry form with out holding an EC Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rulebook. (Article A214.2)
- Please refer to the LIEC Show Information and General Rules which apply to all LIEC competitions.
- All decisions of the Show Committee are final.
