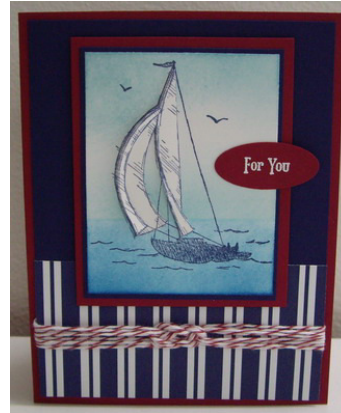


# Paper Tole Technique by Loll Thompson

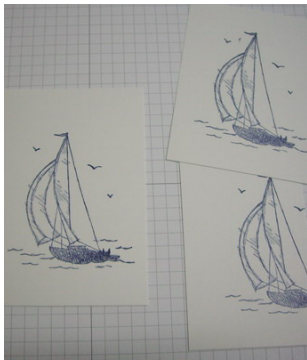
Paper Tole is the art of constructing a 3-dimensional image from a 2-dimensional print (or stamped image).

## Supplies:

- Stamp
- Ink
- Cardstock
- Scissors
- Glue dots



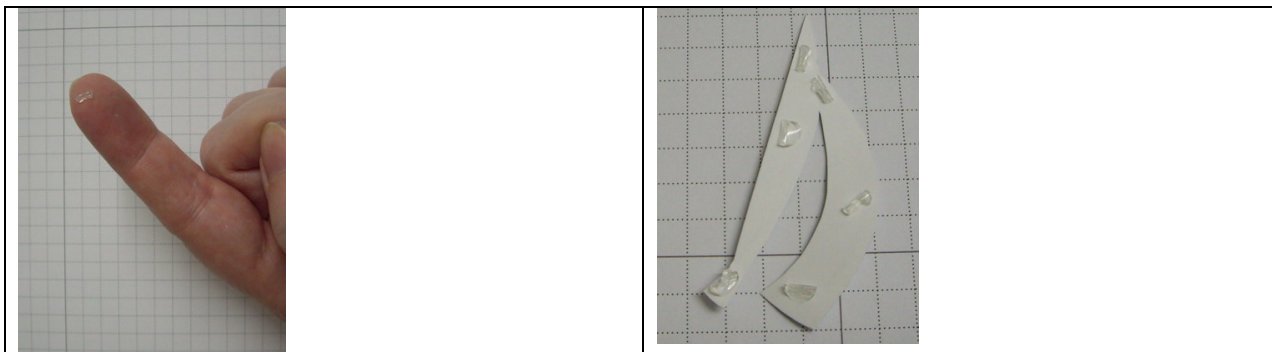
The image I am using has three layers – the base layer, a second layer of the full set of sails and a third layer that is just the turned back part of the sails. Determine how many layers you will need for your stamped image and stamp it that many times onto cardstock.



I sponged the water and sky using post-it notes as masks.



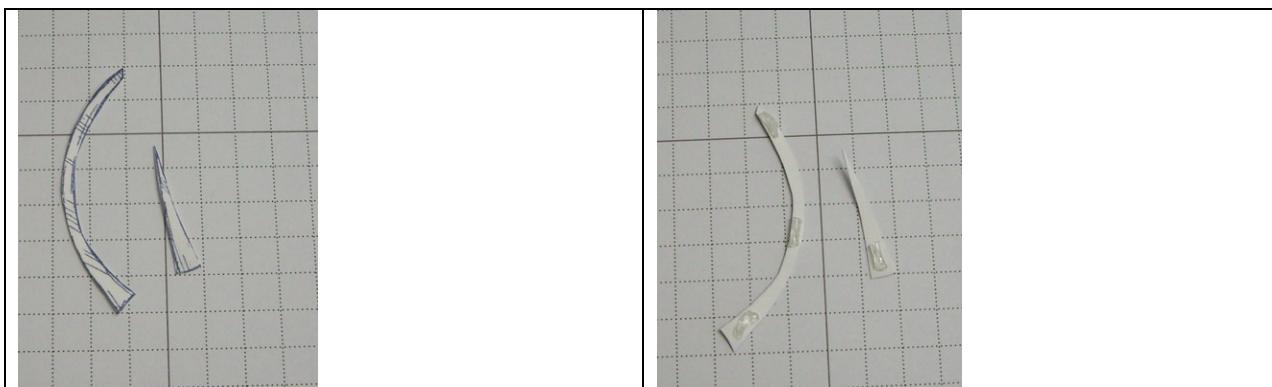
I cut out the first set of sails from one of the extra stamped images. Using a mini glue dot, I used my fingernail to pick up the edge of the glue dot and roll it into a cylinder. This is used to add dimension between the layers of cardstock. I put a few of the rolled glue dots along the back of the sails.



I added the sails on top of my main image and pressed lightly to adhere.



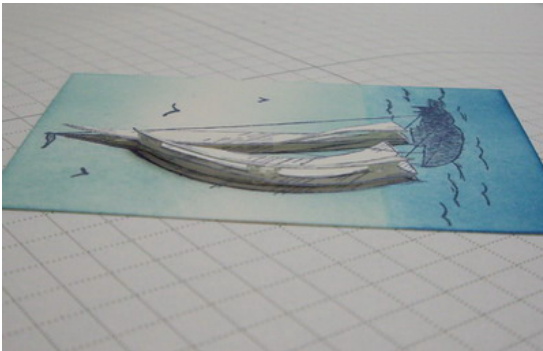
I cut out the next layer of the sails (only the “turned back” parts) and added rolled glue dots to the back of these pieces. You’ll see that one end of the rolled back part is very narrow and a glue dot won’t fit, so I placed a small dab of glue on that end.



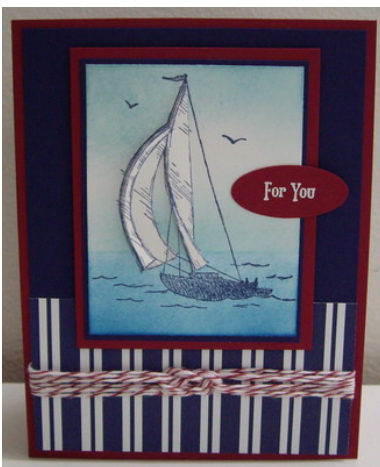
I added the final layer of sails on top of my main image and pressed lightly to adhere.



Here is a side view of the card, showing the layers of cardstock.



I finished my card.
