**1.0 CALL TO ORDER. Establish Quorum**

- Jim Bohun called to order at 703pm.

**2.0 APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

- **MOTION:** Marg Bowler moved that the agenda be approved, seconded by Pearl Biggar, carried.

**3.0 APPROVAL OF THE PREVIOUS MINUTES**

- **MOTION:** Curtis Steinke moved that the previous minutes be approved, seconded by David Van Meter, carried.

#### 4.0 EPS Report – Constable Gagne

- No report.

#### 5.0 FINANCIAL REQUESTS

5.1 - Guy Sopiwynek requested that the Community League send four coaches to soccer coach classes on April 24<sup>th</sup>. The cost would be \$45 per coach for a total of \$180.

- **MOTION:** Curtis Steinke moved that the Executive approve the expense of \$180 for soccer coach classes to be arranged by Guy, seconded by Steve Twigg, carried.

5.2 – Curtis Steinke reported that the volunteers from the turkey dinner believed there was a shortage of some kitchen equipment that ought to be purchased for the hall. The request was made for the purchase of an additional 6 potato peelers, 6 paring knives, and 3 pie servers. Curtis to check with Marg Pratley regarding about what is and isn't in inventory before purchasing.

- **MOTION** – David Van Meter moved that the Executive approve the expenditure for the necessary kitchen supplies to a maximum of \$50, seconded by Pearl Biggar.

- **AMMENDMENT** – Guy Sopiwynek moved that the maximum expenditure be raised to \$100, seconded by Rita Kolpak, carried.

#### 7.0 CORRESPONDENCE/ANNOUNCEMENTS

7.1 AGM – There are still vacancies for several positions on the Executive, notably Adult and Family Programs, Grant Coordinator, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President for which no one has put their name forward. Nonetheless all positions are open for nomination from any member of the community league if they wish.

#### 8.0 REPORTS

9.8 - Newsletter/Publicity: Rita Kolpak

- Approximately \$650 in advertising for the newsletter. Rita mentioned that there is a lack of communication between the person sending invoices for newsletter advertising and the treasurer who receives payment for the advertising.

- Rita will send out an email to the group list regarding the AGM.
- Garage Sale/Garbage Fair/Grounds Cleanup to be advertised in the next newsletter.
- It was noted that we are unable to charge for movie screenings based upon our contract. Donations are acceptable. There was an error in advertising in the past month's newsletter, which requested payment for viewing the film. Mary-Jo will contact David Salmon and look into what is and is not acceptable by our contract. An email will be forwarded to the group to advise on policy once we become aware.

#### 8.1 **President's Report:** Jim Bohun

- GAIN courses are available and are mandatory for anyone with signing authority. Those who haven't taken them yet should look into it sooner than later.
- May 5<sup>th</sup> Community Connections event to be held at Woodcroft Public Library branch. There was discussion about the playschool setting up a booth as well as selling memberships. A letter to be forwarded to the playschool. Pearl Biggar will look into more information.
- There has been continued correspondence regarding the \$1000 donation from Coronation School Council. As discussed at previous meetings this is clearly a Parent Council issue and is for them to resolve.

#### 8.2 **Past President's Report:** David Beckman

- None.

#### 8.3 **1<sup>st</sup> Vice President's Report:** David Van Meter

- Playschool report from Haruko was given by David. The new sink has been installed. There was a recent tour on an ETS bus. The playschool continues to look for more students. There was a request if storing the large balls in the mechanical room is acceptable. Steve Twigg stated that this is not acceptable as it poses a fire hazard. It was suggested that if they are seasonal they may be stored in the rink shack. Steve Twigg further reiterated that there should be nothing kept in the mechanical room at all. The playschool fundraiser brought in \$4,700 of revenue with expenses of \$1,000.
- Volunteer appreciation dinner. David has not received all of the volunteer lists from the Chairs. Marie-Jo was also looking for volunteers to help work at the dinner (set-up/clean-up/presentations/distributing invitations). A list of volunteers to be recognized was also solicited.
- **MOTION:** David Van Meter moved that Melissa Steinke be nominated for Volunteer of the Year, seconded by Jim Bohun, carried.
- Invitations to be sent to our School Trustees, Council Members, MP and MLA.

#### 8.4 **2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President's Report:** Mary Joe Bruneau

- It was suggested that someone get in touch with Coronation regarding the save the school meeting. There are currently 120 students at the school, up 39% from the time of the last sustainability review. There was general discussion regarding how we could support the school (financially and otherwise).

- David Van Meter spoke to the budgets that will be going forward at the AGM. The swimming expense should be taken out as the pool is expected to close. The playschool budget forecasts a slight loss this year; there are hopes for more enrolment. There are lowered expenses but not income in the soccer budget. The adjustment of the soccer budget will occur after March 25<sup>th</sup>. Interest revenue should be nil as there is no interest coming from our bank accounts. Any questions can be forwarded to Jerod.

8.7 **Community Services Representative:** Jennifer Finnigan

- NGCL received the \$1000 top up for the playground.
- Community Social Worker, Nicole Magilton, will attend our May meeting to introduce herself to explain her role.
- Operating Grant is due April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- National Volunteer Week is April 18<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup>. Second Cup vouchers were distributed to Board Members.
- National Youth Week is May 1<sup>st</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup>.
- Capital City Cleanup – April 15<sup>th</sup> deadline for applications
- Community Bin Grant due April 30<sup>th</sup> – Up to \$2000 is available for a community garbage bin. More information can be found on the city website. Money is on a first come first serve basis. An event could be hosted around this. The question was raised whether this could be used for the rink demolition.

9.0 **STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS**

9.1 **Buildings & Grounds:** Stever Twigg

- One of the furnaces died and a new thermocouple was ordered and installed. Leaking gas line was also repaired
- Washer in the kitchen sink was installed.

9.1.1 **Kitchen Keeper:** Marg Pratley

- Marg will be putting up washing instructions for the tablecloths and will be checking to see how many pie servers we have.

9.1.2 **Daytime Contact –** Marg Bowler

- GRIP Program – Melissa had expressed that she felt comfortable having this group use the space during the time requested. There should be no conflict with other summer programs. The question was raised whether or not the playschool could charge rent or would simply donate the space. Proceeds, if any, will be directed to the playschool. The kitchen will not be a part of the agreement, except as a snack prep area. Use of the toys and equipment is acceptable provided there is a final cleanup. The playschool was granted authority to make whatever decision they see fit. The group will be required to carry their own insurance.
- There were some complaints that no ice sheet was provided this year. There was simply no time or appropriate window to supply any ice this year.
- Several requests were made regarding another Long Time Resident's Tea but someone would be required to organize the event. Last year's event cost \$150. It was suggested that this be an annual event in September. This will be left up to next year's Executive. Dates will need to be confirmed with Diane Etchevery.

- Concern was raised that when anyone is using the hall, if the hall is left unattended for any period of time, the doors need to be locked.

**9.2 Family & Adult Programs: Curtis Steinke**

- None.

**9.2.1 Playschool: Melissa / Haruko**

- Curtis Steinke reported that indoor playgroup is doing well. There were 73 people at the last movie night. 20 people attended the last pub night.
- Annual Bike Camp will be held Sat. May 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Green Shack program – We have been approved for several programs
- Soccer Camps to be held July 26-30<sup>th</sup>, August 9-13<sup>th</sup>.
- Fathers Day BBQ will be held Sat. June 26<sup>th</sup>.
- Scrap-To-It – A very successful event, next one is to be held Sept. 17-19<sup>th</sup>, Feb.12-14<sup>th</sup> 2011 was also requested.
- November 6<sup>th</sup> Turkey Dinner had \$75 tickets sold.
- Coronation School sent thanks for the subsidization of the T-shirt printing. Coronation is accepting used cell phones and printer cartridges. Coronation will be falling into the West Sector Review and would appreciate any support they can get. Also noted that as an IB school they qualify for city wide bussing.

**9.11 Park Development: Curtis Steinke**

- We've received approval to remove the rink. It must be brought back to grade and sodded or seeded. It can then be removed from our leased area at which point we qualify for subsidization from the City for the redevelopments costs. Anticipated cost of \$20,000 to remove the rink and bring it to the city standards. CFEP Grant will cover 50% to match whatever costs incurred for redevelopment. This issue will be brought forward at the AGM. There was some discussion about the costs. It was resolved that the rink need be removed as it is a hazard and the community was already consulted regarding this. Curtis stressed that the surveys need to be completed by community members so that support can be shown to the city for the redevelopment. After some discussion, it was noted that regardless of what the new park consists of, the existing rink needs to be removed.
